



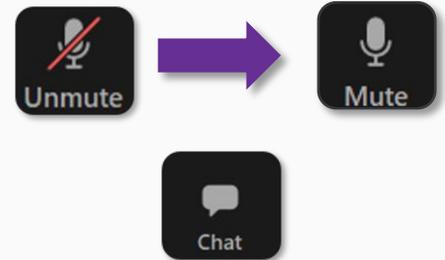

Capacity Planning is Essential to PACE Growth



- Supports workforce stability
 - Helps prevent staff burnout
 - Strengthens staff capacity to sustain organizational growth
 - Incorporates time for effective onboarding and training
- Prevents bottlenecks in participant care
 - Ensures the consistent delivery of high-quality care
 - Reduces the likelihood of disruptions or concerns for current participants
- Establishes a strong foundation for continued growth

Leadership & People Readiness – WHAT & WHY?

Readiness for Change – the AIM

- ***Operations & Systems:***

- Intake & enrollment process (referral resources, Medicaid eligibility process, assessments, etc.)
- IDT – philosophy
- Electronic Health Record
- Communication software (phones, scheduling, etc.)
- Transportation routing software
- Preventing Disenrollments – Participant advocate/onboarding.

Space and Facilities Planning

- Building Attributes – new or existing remodel?
- Space considerations – make room for more.
- Design & Layout considerations – (i.e., bathrooms, flow, etc.)
- Furniture/equipment needs
- Parking
- Capital planning
